- We know how many disabled children live in our area and plan our services to meet their needs.



- We have 1 named person in charge of services for disabled children and their families.



- We can show that we work with Local Authorities and have a say in the Children and Young People's plans in our area.



- All staff have been trained to make sure they can work with disabled children. Some staff have special training and other staff know how to get in touch with these people.



- Parents, young people and carers get good information and advice about all the services they can use.



- Disabled children and young people help us to write our Disability Equality Scheme and check it is working. We will use this when we plan health services in our area to make sure disabled children and young people are treated fairly.



- We will make our community equipment and wheelchair services work better. We will make sure that equipment is good quality and ready for children when they need it.



- We will make sure that special health services are available for children who need them and that Local Authorities have good information about these services.



- We can show that disabled young people and adult services are working together to make sure moving to adult services is easy for disabled young people.
