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1 Introduction

In 2009 the Government introduced the Aiming High for Disabled Children (AHDC) initiative to transform services and support for disabled children and their families. There were two clear aspects to the Government's agenda. Firstly, the transformation of how services and support are provided to children with disabilities and their carers and, secondly, funding for a significant increase in the level of short breaks.

On 1st April 2011 the Breaks for Carers of Disabled Children Regulations (2011) placed a duty on Local Authorities to provide short breaks to children and young people with disabilities and their families. These Regulations state:

1. In performing their duty under paragraph 6(1)(c) of Schedule 2 to the 1989 Act, a local authority must provide, so far as is reasonably practicable, a range of services which is sufficient to assist carers to continue to provide care or to do so more effectively.
2. In particular, the local authority must provide, as appropriate, a range of:
 - (a) day-time care in the homes of disabled children or elsewhere;
 - (b) overnight care in the homes of disabled children or elsewhere;
 - (c) educational or leisure activities for disabled children outside their homes, and
 - (d) services available to assist carers in the evenings, at weekends and during the school holidays.

The regulations also place a duty on the Local Authority to, by 1st October 2011, in consultation with carers, prepare and publish "a short breaks services statement" setting out details of:

- a) The range of services provided in their area
- b) Any criteria by which eligibility for those services will be assessed
- c) The range of services designed to meet the needs of carers in their area.

In April 2011 the Local Authority published its Short Break Care Sufficiency Plan. This plan:

1. Reviewed current provision
2. Undertook a needs assessment involving consulting extensively with children with disabilities and their carers
3. Identified areas for prioritising for development.

This Short Break Care Services Statement has been made available for comment to 600 parents who are registered with the Aiming High Information Service and parent groups such as those held at the Kerith Family Church and by Friends of EarlyBird. The comments received have been incorporated into the Statement.

2 Principles

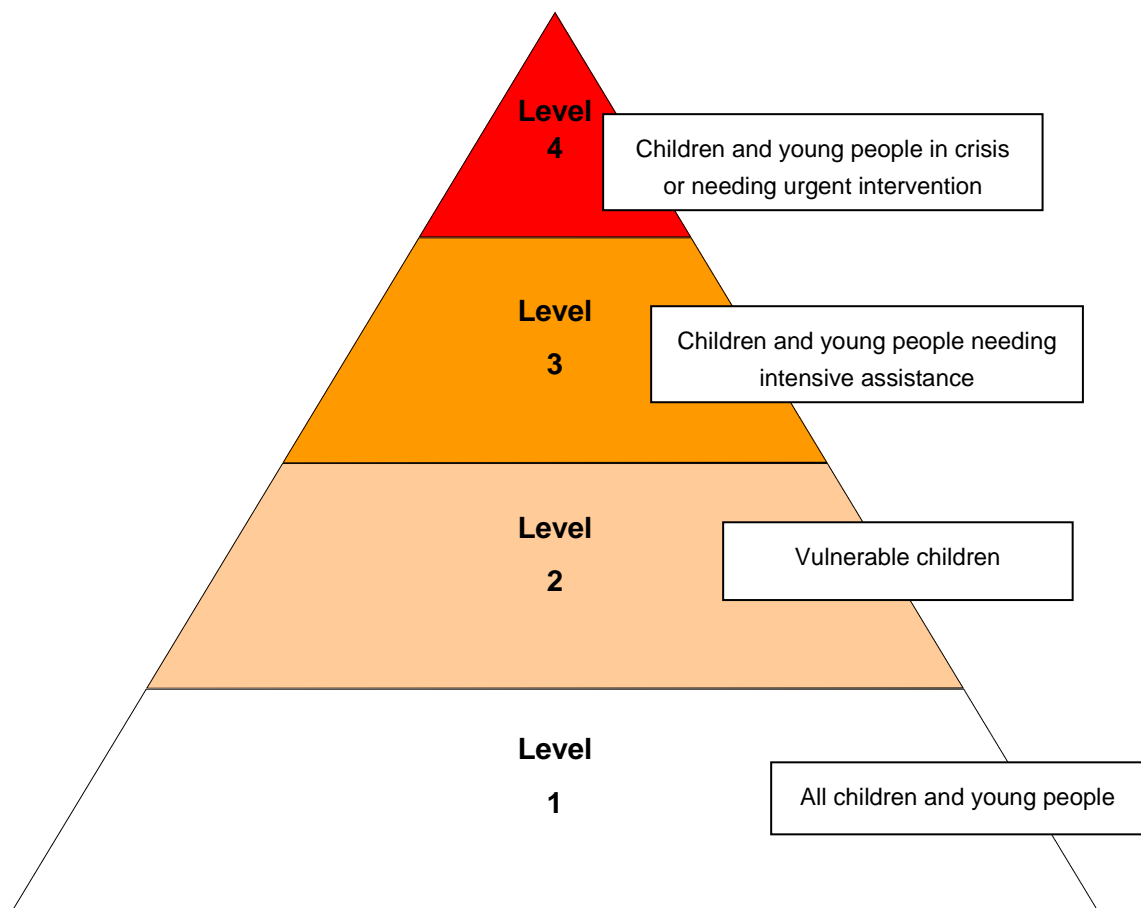
As a consequence of additional funding from Central Government and the continued commitment of Bracknell Forest Council over the last two years there has been a significant increase in the number and range of short breaks available for disabled children and their families in Bracknell Forest.

Short breaks form a continuum of services, which support disabled children and their families. They are provided to give:

- Children and young people with a disability enjoyable experiences away from their primary carers, thereby contributing to their personal and social development;
- Parents, carers and families a necessary and valuable break from caring responsibilities.

Additional funding and resources have been provided to a variety of settings. These settings are often referred to as:

- **Level 1** - Universal e.g. mainstream after school and holiday clubs, childminders, sports clubs, brownies
- **Level 2** - Targeted e.g. holiday schemes or Saturday clubs specifically for children with disabilities
- **Level 3** - Specialist e.g. services accessed following an assessment by Children's Social Care
- **Level 4** - Crisis/ Intensive e.g. specialist residential care placements or emergency placements in foster care.



Our needs analysis undertaken in 2008 and updated annually has identified the need to further develop universal and targeted services. Through this we have been able to reduce some of the pressure on specialist and crisis services. In developing local provision our key principles have been:

- Focusing on developing universal and targeted settings
- Creating sustainable activities

- Ensuring value for money
- Providing activities at the same cost or less than would be available to any other child
- Reducing bureaucracy/ the need for eligibility criteria
- Offering positive activities for children and young people
- Providing breaks when parent/ carers want them

3 Range of Services and Eligibility Criteria

There is a wide range of short breaks available for children with disabilities up to the age of 18 years old. However certain activities will take young people up to the age of 19 years old. Information about these activities, including criteria and age range, is disseminated via the Aiming High Service through regular email updates and mail shots. Information is also contained on the Bracknell Forest website. Within Appendix A there is included a copy of the most recent update of activities available.

Activities and support available can be divided into 3 main areas; Universal, Targeted and Specialist settings.

3.1 Universal Settings

A number of universal services and providers have developed provision for children with disabilities including after school, holiday and weekend clubs. Activities such as karate, dance and football have been developed and are popular. Additional capacity and activities have been developed by Children's Centres, Early Years and Extended Services. We have also developed training and a fund to support the inclusion of children to access mainstream settings. These activities are available directly via the provider.

There are no formal assessment processes or eligibility criteria set down to access these services and fees are applied by the provider.

3.2 Targeted Settings

There has been a substantial increase in the range and volume of targeted short breaks, in particular Saturday clubs and holiday schemes. The criteria for accessing these activities are determined by the provider and are based on factors such as age, type of disability and potential risks.

There are no formal assessment processes or eligibility criteria set down to access these services. Wherever possible the Council has subsidised these services so that only a small fee is applied by the provider.

3.3 Specialist Settings

Specialist services and support including Larchwood Short Break Unit, short break foster carers, direct payments, home care and agency support, community childminders and independent short break providers are provided by the Local Authority.

Services are determined following an assessment by Children's Social Care. Details of this can be found on the Bracknell Forest Website. <http://www.bracknell-forest.gov.uk/accessing-childrens-social-care-services.pdf>. There is no fee payable for these services.

Berkshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust also provide, through the Children's Community Nursing and Respite Service, support, provision of nursing input and access to their short break health respite unit in Maidenhead. Details of this service can be found on the Berkshire East Community Health Service website www.berkshire-eastchs.nhs.uk

4 Services to Meet the Needs of Carers

Parent/ carers are supported within Bracknell Forest in a number of ways.

4.1 Parent Groups

There are a number of parent groups in Bracknell Forest such as Kerith Konnections, Friends of EarlyBird and the Dialogue Group. Mencap, National Autistic Society and other national organisations also provide support in the area. Details can be found within Appendix A and information about groups is regularly sent out to parents via the Aiming High Service.

4.2 Parent Support Groups & Training

There are a number of parent training courses available to support parents/ carers of children with disabilities. There are universal courses available, which are advertised across settings as well as some specific targeted training around behaviour management and children with autism. Details are available via the Aiming High Service or Bracknell Forest Council Parenting Co-ordinator.

4.3 Children's Social Care

For families where support in the community is not sufficient to meet the needs of their child, Children's Social Care based on an assessment of the whole needs of the family, including the Carer's needs, will develop a support or care plan. This may involve providing support within the home, the provision of foster care or other support to enable the family to have a break.

4.4 Children's Community Nursing Team

For families where the health needs of their child are complex and the support available locally is not sufficient, following an assessment, the Children's Community Nursing Team may provide support such as care within the home or respite at their short break unit in Maidenhead.

4.5 Carers Grant

Grants are made available each year for parents/ carers of disabled children to enable them to have a break. This is advertised widely by the Aiming High Service and is targeted to provide support to vulnerable families, who may not have the resources to fund short breaks.

5 Summary

Bracknell Forest Council is committed to supporting children with disabilities and their families. Information about support available is made readily available through the Aiming High Service through emails, mail shots and the Bracknell Forest website. Appendix A provides for a more detailed description of activities available at the time of writing this statement.

Through an annual consultation with parents of children with disabilities, children and professionals combined with the data and information collected by the Council, local provision is reviewed and developed annually to meet the needs within Bracknell Forest. The most recent review is outlined in our Short Break Care Sufficiency Plan published in April 2011.

This Short Break Statement will be updated at least every three years with the action plan reviewed and developed by Children's Social Care Management team and Aiming High for Disabled Children's Steering group annually. These reviews will be supported through the continuing consultation with parents, children with disabilities and professionals.

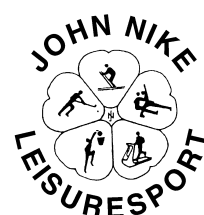

Funding available to support mainstream settings

The Inclusion Fund has been allocated some funding again this year from the Aiming High budget.

The main purpose of this fund is to improve access for children and young people with disabilities within a universal or mainstream setting. Mainstream providers such as after school clubs and holiday schemes (e.g Holly Spring, Edgbarrow sports centre, Sandy Lane and WASPS) can meet the needs of children with moderate learning difficulties but initial support may be required to ensure a positive integration.

Subject to referral to a small panel of professionals, funding can be made available on a short term and temporary basis for additional staff; to enable greater independence through equipment or improved access; or to enhance training and expertise in the setting.

Children accessing these settings would typically require minimal supervision, have moderate learning difficulties, be on school action or school action plus and need some initial support to build confidence.

For children and young people with more complex needs or who require a higher level of support, where a mainstream setting is not appropriate, activities and holiday schemes are available predominantly through Konnections and Kids.
